

## how you Can Give


Gifts of any size are welcomed. The Foundation's status as a public charity offers you the maximum tax benefits.

Donors have established charitable funds with the following:

Donors are able to establish endowment funds to serve the needs of a cause they wish to help with. These funds are often established using your family name or the name of a loved one as a memorial or honorarium. \$10,000.00 can establish a named fund at SJCHF. Foundation staff will be happy to discuss your specific interests with you. The assets are invested and managed by local banks and investment firms.

The Foundation uses the income generated from its endowment to provide grants to local tax-exempt charitable organizations. Community volunteers serve on the board and grants review committee. All grants are approved by the Foundation's Board of Directors.



## when the grants Are Given

The Foundation uses a two-part application process. Letters of Intent are due mid October each year. Approved LOI projects receive an invitation to apply for a grant in mid November with a December 31 application deadline. Grants are awarded mid March. 
